In September, our students started a school based educational programme to improve links between all students in Grange CC.

This programme is being piloted alongside Ms. Katie Cremin, School of Psychology, Trinity College Dublin, and will be running into the New Year 2017. Twelve students from Transition Year have been selected to work alongside six students from the Gareth Suite.

To end what was a very enjoyable morning we all engaged in play based activities and games. For a social activity we plan to all meet up again in Coolock and watch a film together.




Samples of class based learning activities in the Gareth Suite.
