Baseline data	Attendance					
	• There is a need for consideration of the attendance of senior cycle students.					
	• Attendance of Junior Cycle students for the year August 2014 - June 2015 was 87.29%. There is a need to increase the full day attendance of Junior Cycle students.					
	• Statistics for attendance in 2014-2015 indicate that the problem of the fall-off in afternoon attendance needs to be addressed.					
	• A study of the School Completion Programme shows that whole-school attendance in September 2014 was 88.84%.

	<ul> <li>The student cohort that had been the focus of the Deis plan finishing in June 2015 was extensively tested for improvement in reading age at the end of the previous school year 2014. As the previous report shows they had made significant gains in this area.</li> <li>Testing took place to assess the progress on the target that those in first year (2012) with a 4<sup>th</sup> class equivalent reading age will have progressed to a minimum of 1<sup>st</sup> year standard by the end of third year. The average reading age of the students in</li> </ul>					
	Feb 2012 was 10.3, which increased to an average reading age of 13.3, an overall increase of 3 years in 27 months. This represents an increase from an average entrance score of 4.3, which is 4 <sup>th</sup> class standard, to 13.3 at the end of second year when repeat testing took place.					
	• To assess the progress on the target that pupils in 1 <sup>st</sup> year (2012) will have mastered a range of keywords relevant to each subject area teachers were asked to test students on their knowledge of keywords which have been on display in their classrooms.					
	<ul> <li>In an endeavour to foster a school-wide culture of reading in the school the Drop Everything And Read programme was carried out for one week. It was felt by teachers that the students were marginally less enthusiastic than the previous year and it was suggested that the activity needs to be varied from year to year.</li> </ul>					
	<ul> <li>The target that aims to increase the percentage of students taking higher level papers at Junior certificate relates to the students who are now in third year. Currently there are two classes in English catering for the three levels at Junior Certificate level, so those who could attempt higher level are facilitated. Teachers will continue to encourage students to perform at the highest possible level.</li> </ul>

	<ul> <li>The newly developed maths competency test will be administered at entrance testing and will be providing specific information for the Project Maths Junior Cert Syllabus.</li> <li>We continue to hold the target which aims to increase numbers taking Higher level Maths at Junior Certificate from 0% (year 1) to 25% (year 2).</li> <li>There are two classes for Leaving Certificate Maths this year in order to enable students to take higher level maths.</li> </ul>
